People and Appearance

When you meet someone new, one of the first things you do is describe what they look like. In English, we use special words to talk about people's **appearance** — their height, build, hair, eyes, and age. These words are very important for everyday conversations!

Read this short situation and notice the words in **bold**:

"This is my friend Sara. She is **tall** and **slim**. She has **long, dark** hair and **brown** eyes. She is **young** — she is twenty years old. Her brother Tom is **short** and has **short, curly, blonde** hair. He wears **glasses**."

In this lesson, you will learn essential vocabulary for describing **people and appearance** in English.

1. Height and Build

These words describe how **tall** or **big** a person is.

These words describe a person's **hair colour**, **length**, and **style**.

short hair	<i>noun phrase</i> — hair that does not grow very far; above the ears or neck	My dad has short hair .	very short, quite short
curly hair	<i>noun phrase</i> — hair that has a round, spiral shape	My sister has curly hair . It is very thick.	wavy hair = not fully curly, not fully straight

moustache	<i>noun</i> — hair that grows above a man's top lip	My father has a small moustache .	have a moustache, grow a moustache
glasses	<i>noun (plural)</i> — a frame with two pieces of glass or plastic that a person wears to see better	My teacher wears glasses to read.	wear glasses, take off glasses
freckles	<i>noun (plural)</i> — small brown spots on the skin, especially on the face	She has freckles on her nose and cheeks.	have freckles — common with fair skin and red hair
young	<i>adjective</i> — not old; in the early part of life	She is very young — only eighteen years old.	quite young, very young
old	<i>adjective</i> — having lived for a long time; not young	My grandfather is old . He is eighty years old.	very old, quite old

Collocations & Useful Expressions

In English, certain words go together naturally. Learn these common collocations for **people and appearance**:

have + hair description

She has long, dark hair.

He has short, curly, blonde hair.

have + eyes

My mother has beautiful green eyes.

He has dark brown eyes.

wear + glasses

My teacher wears glasses every day.

have + a beard / a moustache

My uncle has a long beard.

Does your father have a moustache?

look + adjective

She looks young for her age.

He looks tired today.

be + height/build adjective

She is tall and slim.

He is short and well-built.

What does he/she look like?

"What does your sister look like?" — "She is tall with long blonde hair."

This is the most common question to ask about someone's appearance.

He/She looks like + a person

She looks like her mother — they have the same eyes.

Important Differences & Confusing Words

Look Like vs Look

These two expressions are easy to confuse for beginners:

What does he look like? — We use this to ask about *appearance* (how a person looks physically).

Answer: "He is tall with dark hair and glasses."

What is he like? — We use this to ask about *personality* (what kind of person he is).

Answer: "He is very kind and funny."

Remember: **"What does she look like?"** = appearance. **"What is she like?"** = personality or character.

Pretty vs Handsome vs Beautiful

- **Pretty** — attractive, used mainly for women, girls, and sometimes children. *She is a pretty girl.*
- **Handsome** — attractive in a strong way, used mainly for men and boys. *He is a handsome man.*
- **Beautiful** — very attractive, used for women, girls, places, or things. It is stronger than "pretty". *She is a beautiful woman.*

Thin vs Slim vs Skinny

- **Slim** — thin in an attractive, healthy way. *She is slim and healthy.*
- **Thin** — not fat; neutral word. *He is quite thin.*
- **Skinny** — very thin, sometimes too thin. Can sound negative. *He is very skinny — he needs to eat more!*

Old vs Elderly

- **Old** — a simple adjective for people or things that have existed for a long time. *He is an old man.*

- **Elderly** — a polite and respectful word for old people. *She is an elderly woman who lives alone.* This is more polite in formal situations.

Common Mistakes

Here are some common mistakes that beginners make when talking about **people and appearance**:

✗ She has a long hairs.

✓ **She has long hair.** — "Hair" is an uncountable noun in English. We do not say "hairs" when talking about a person's hair in general.

✗ He is wear glasses.

✓ **He wears glasses.** — Use the simple present tense: "wears", not "is wear".

✗ She is pretty hair.

✓ **She has pretty hair.** — We use "have/has" to describe features like hair and eyes, not "is/are".

✗ What he looks like?

✓ **What does he look like?** — Remember to use "does" in questions with "he/she/it".

✗ She looks like tall.

✓ **She looks tall.** — After "look" + adjective, we do NOT use "like". Use "like" only before a noun: "She looks like her sister."

✗ He has a bald.

✓ **He is bald.** — "Bald" is an adjective. We say "he is bald", not "he has a bald".

✗ My grandfather is very old. He is elderly.

✓ **My grandfather is elderly.** — Choose one word. Both mean the same thing but "elderly" is the polite choice for people.

42. Correct Answer: My brother is tall and thin. ✓ Explanation: When describing a person's appearance, we use the structure subject + verb to be + adjectives. Two adjectives can be joined with and, as in tall and thin.
43. Correct Answer: He has blue eyes and a big smile. ✓ Explanation: We use have/has to describe physical features. Adjectives (blue, big) always go before the noun they describe (eyes, smile).
